This course discusses various leadership concepts, approaches to leadership studies, situational approaches to leader behavior, concepts of power and influence, leadership and managerial job characteristics, leadership roles, leadership styles and levels of maturity of subordinates, and leadership in a democratic country. Learning activities include providing information, discussions, assignments, presentations, and leadership role play (giving briefings, leading meetings, playing roles in seminar forums, discussions and decision-making practices). Evaluation of learning outcomes is done through written tests, assignments, presentations and performances in role play.</p>
