	This course focuses on the principles and methods of public policy analysis, providing students with the tools to evaluate and design effective policies. Students will learn how to assess policy alternatives, analyze data, and understand the political, economic, and social factors that influence policy decisions. The course emphasizes the importance of evidence-based decision-making and equips students with the skills to critically analyze				

	existing policies and propose solutions to public sector challenges. Through collaborative case studies and policy simulations, students will develop teamwork in policy evaluation, enhance leadership in decision-making processes, and strengthen public speaking skills in presenting policy recommendations. Additionally, the course fosters critical analysis in assessing policy impacts and enhances problem-solving skills in formulating innovative and effective policy solutions.
